Closest accessible parking:

- One accessible parking bay in the Paspaley Plaza Car park at the back of Post Office
- One accessible parking bay in Carnarvon Street at the front of Post Office

Pick up / set down bay: There is one bay between Paspaley Shopping Centre and the Post Office with ramp access to the pathway.

Closest public transport: Town Bus Stop on either Carnarvon Street, about 5 minutes away or on Dampier Terrace, about 7-10 minutes away

Closest accessible toilet: In Paspaley Shopping Centre, about 2 minutes away.

Signage: Signage is good, clear and easy to read with large lettering and good colour contrast.

External access: A barrier free level footpath connects pedestrian traffic to the entrance.

Main entrance: Entrance door is glazed and automatic opening with level access.

Internal: Circulation space between queuing aisles is 1200mm and sufficient for most styles of wheelchair (Y+). Wheelchairs can access most other areas. The flooring is vinyl. Writing tables are at standing height.

Displays: The displays are at both sitting and standing height.

Payment / service counters: At standing height.

Cueing system: Counter service operates by the customer service staff calling 'next please'. There are no visual prompts.

Accessible toilet: Very close in the Paspaley Shopping Centre complex next to Coles.
