Cable Beach Foreshore Reserve

Summary: A grassy reserve with toilets, restaurants, picnic tables and playground.

Location: Cable Beach Foreshore.

Type: Community Park.

Closest accessible parking: One accessible parking bay on Cable Beach car park.

Pick up / set down bay: No.

Closest Public transport: Town Bus Stop close to the reserve.

Closest accessible toilet: There is one accessible unisex toilet.

Signage: No directional signage is provided in the park.

Access from Cable Beach car park: Wide brick paved pathways with various gradients connects the Cable Beach car park to reserve and facilities (eg. toilets, playground, rest area and restaurant).

Internal access: The reserve is a grassed area with just a few trees giving shade.

Onsite accessible facilities:

Playground: A playground areas with sand underfoot, shade clothed and with a border surrounding it. There is one table with bench seating nearby, shaded by large trees.

Picnic Area: There is a fixed bench style table and seats set in the lawn. The Seat height is about 450mm.

Unisex Accessible toilet: One unisex accessible toilet is provided and is located in the toilet block approximately 2 meters from the playground. It is kept unlocked during daylight hours. (Please see Report on Cable Beach Public Toilet for further information).

Drinking fountain: There is an accessible drinking fountain just next to the toilet block and the playground.
