## **Irukandji Town Beach Cafe**

**Location:** Town Beach Reserve, Robinson Street, Broome

**Type:** Alfresco café and Take away, Australian style. Counter service for ordering and Take away. Staff will be happy to take orders from table, if required.

**Opening hours:** Tuesday to Sunday 7.00am – 4.00pm

**Closest accessible parking:**

There is one designated disabled parking bay available within the ample carpark.

**Pick up / set down bay:** No.

**Closest public transport:** Town Bus stop about 7minutes away, at Broome Historical Museum

**Accessible toilet:** Nearby

**Signage:** No directional signage

**External access:** A barrier free 2000mm wide pedestrian brick paved path takes you to it. Wheelchair access (Y++)

**Entrance door:** Wide open 1550mm open door.

**Internal:** Tiled floor with good wheelchair circulation. The menu is clear and easy to read.

**Food counter:** The counter is standing height of 980mm.

**Alfresco:** There are two entrances to the dining area, both 1550mm wide. One has a step down of 130mm. The other is via the internal area. The dining area is brick paved with sailcloth shades overhead. There are overhead fans under the eave area. The tables are central pedestal with good knee clearance.

**Seating:** The chairs are movable with backs and armrests. The seating height is 450mm.

**Menu:** These are easy to read.

**Accessible toilet:** There is one unisex accessible toilet close by and adjacent to the café, with approx. 15 metre distance. See report Town Beach Reserve Public Toilet for more information.
