Closest public transport: Town Bus stop on Cable Beach Road about 5-7min away.

Accessible toilet: In the Boulevard Shopping Centre on Frederick Street about 12-15min away.

Pick up / set down bay: No.

Accessible Parking: There is one accessible parking bay in the car park.

Signage: Clear and easy to read signage from roadway.

External access: A 1200mm wide concrete path with handrail and a 2.2 degree gradient (1.22) connects the accessible parking to the main entrance of the centre.

Main entrance: There are two entry doors. One with a ramp access the other has a step of 150mm. The ramp access door is a 920mm wide sliding door. The other door is a sliding door as well, 750mm wide with a 'D' handle. Wheelchair patrons may wish to phone ahead to ensure the ramp access door will be open.

Internal: There is sufficient space for all styles of wheelchairs to move through the centre. The centre has low pile carpeting throughout.

Reception: The reception counter is at standing height.

Waiting Area: The waiting area has both firm and soft seating with armrests. The seat height is 500mm.

Information: Displays and brochures are at sitting and standing heights.

Treatment Room: There are three treatment rooms with a door width of 760mm. The treatment table is 570mm and the chair height is 460mm. The circulation space is adequate (Y).
