Location: Cnr Hamersley / Carnarvon Street, Broome

Type: Internal and alfresco areas for breakfast, lunch and dinner. Australian and European style menu. They offer homebrew ales and have a curry hut as well.

Bookings taken: Yes, only for groups of eight or more.

Closest accessible parking: Ample parking on car park of Hamersley Street and street parking on Carnarvon Street.

Pick up / set down bay: No.

Closest public transport: Town Bus stop just outside Matso's on Carnarvon Street.

Accessible toilet: Nearest accessible toilet at Broome Public Library approx. 5 minutes away during day time.

Signage: Good clear signage on Hamersley Street.

External access: Barrier free pedestrian ramp of 3 Degree (1.19) with handrails.

Entrance door: Open door 970mm wide. Easy wheelchair access (Y+).

Internal: Wooden floor with ample circulation space for wheelchairs (Y++).

Bar & payment counter: These are at standing height.

Seating: The tables have good knee clearance are 760mm high. Table for two have a central pedestal stand. Table for four have corner legs. The chairs are movable with a sitting height of 480mm.

Menu: There is a table menu and a blackboard menu. Both are easy to read with good colour contrast.

Alfresco: There are sailcloth shades for the ground level alfresco area. Tables and chairs are spread apart and have good wheelchair circulation (Y++). The tables are 760mm with good knee clearance. The chairs are movable with a seating height of 460mm.

Curry Hut: Situated in the alfresco area. The counter is at sitting level of 790mm. The menu changes daily open.
