Closest accessible parking: The nearest accessible parking bay is located in Napier Terrace on the opposite side of the street outside the DPI office.

Pick up / set down bay: Possible in the car park which is situated at the front of the bank.

Closest public transport: Town Bus Stop on Carnarvon Street, Male Oval diagonally opposite.

Closest accessible toilet: On Male Oval Carnarvon Street, diagonally opposite.

Signage: Clear and easy to read from roadway.

External access: A barrier free concrete ramp 1350mm wide with a 6.8 (1.9) gradient with a handrail connects the car park set down area to the entrance.

Main entrance: Level entry with automatic doors 980mm wide. Wheelchair access (Y++).

Internal: Tiled flooring and sufficient circulation space for all styles of wheelchairs. There are writing tables at sitting and standing height. Information brochures are at standing height. There are chairs provided for waiting customers and writing desks. The chairs have armrests and backrests with a seat height of 450mm. The offices have low pile carpet.

Teller counters: Is at standing height with Perspex windows.

ATM: The ATM is located outside with a card insertion height of 1400mm.

Cueing system: Counter service operates by the customer service staff calling 'next please'. There are no visual prompts.

Accessible toilet: Closest accessible toilet is located in at Male Oval.
