

## 4. PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

At the meeting of 3 July 2008 the following questions were taken on notice and answers are supplied as shown:

*Question - Kandy Curran: Minyirr Park sent a letter to the Shire regarding the LandCorp Future Fund and awaiting a letter of support.*

*Answer – Chairperson: Cr G T Campbell took the question on notice for this issue to be followed up with Engineering staff.*

*Answer - Director Engineering Services: The letter was sent on 30 July 2008 and a copy was emailed to Fiona Bishop at Rubibi on even date.*

*Question – Kandy Curran: A list of insurable asset items in Minyirr Park was requested and provided to the Shire for consideration to cover items under Shire insurance. As yet Minyirr Park staff have not had a reply.*

*Answer – Director Corporate Services: Since 16 November 2007, the Shire has been requesting a full list of assets/items from Minyirr Park outlining assets that they wish to insure. This information was received 9 June 2008.*

*For insurance purposes, ownership of the asset needs to be determined. In order for the Shire to insure property it should be responsible for loss or damage to it. That is, if an ablution block was damaged or destroyed would the Shire be responsible to pay for repairs / replacement. If this is the case, then the Shire can include the building on the property schedule under Industrial Special Risks Insurance. Full asset maintenance /*

renewal costs would also need to be determined and included in the Long Term Financial Plan and annual budgets.

The list received from Minyirr Park is incomplete and will need to be further developed to ascertain who is the responsible officer/entity and for a comprehensive quote to be obtained for insurance purposes and final Council decision.

Currently we insure the Minyirr Park sea container (\$7,138) and contents (\$6,489). Over the past three years, the Shire has made two insurance claims relating to break-ins and stolen items from the container.

**SUMMARY:** Rubibi requests a continuation of discussion with Shire on vehicle management planning on the Broome Peninsula.

**BACKGROUND**

With Minyirr Park Reserves 19289, 43080 and 36477 including Cable Beach to the high tide water mark, it is important to continue discussing motor vehicle management planning for Cable Beach.

The main concerns that have emerged with increased vehicular access to Cable Beach are: detrimental effects to cultural heritage, damage to the intertidal zone and surrounding coastal environs, accumulation of litter presenting a serious health hazard to the public, increased occurrence of inappropriate antisocial behaviour including reckless and drink driving and an increasing number of obscene acts in public.

Minyirr Park is a joint land-management project of the Shire of Broome and Rubibi. The project arises from the 1999 *Coastal Park Management Plan* (commissioned by the Shire of Broome) and is now in its ninth year of implementation).

**CONSULTATION**

Public consultation on management options should only take place after: (i) the Shire and Rubibi have jointly identified management options to address the issue of vehicle access to Cable Beach; and (ii) the options so identified have been submitted to Council through the Coastal Park Management Committee.
