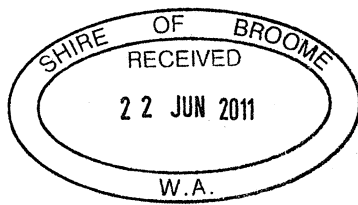

### BLUE & WHITE BUSINESS DIRECTION SIGNS

Thank you for your correspondence dated 5 May 2011, in reference to the Shire of Broome seeking approval for the resumption of delegation to install business direction signs on roads within the township to include Gubinge Road and roads under control of Main Roads and clarification on delegation.

This delegation also does not relinquish the rights of the Commissioner of Main Roads to exercise powers to perform matters covered by the delegation or revoke all or parts of the delegation at his discretion, This regulation will still apply to the now (Director of Main Roads )

Whilst the Shire was delegated approval to install business directions signs in April 1995, it has been noted that the Main Roads guidelines and Australian Standards have not always being applied correctly, with signage installed that does not meet the criteria and numerous requests that where passed back on to Main Roads to process.

Your request to reassume the delegation to now include Main Roads controlled roads, Gubinge Road, Port Drive and Broome Highway up to and inclusive of the 12 Mile Community is approved.

Installations are subject to the rules and policies contained in Australian Standard AS1742.-6 -2004. (Section 5.5 Community Facilities – non expressway)

The delegation is subject to the Shire undertaking to the removal of unapproved advertising signs and the removal of existing signs that do not meet the criteria as detailed in A.S. 1742-6

Local Industrial Areas are to be signed with the standard chevron signs indicating LIA.


Advance signs can only be installed for business such as caravan parks and similar which generate large volumes of traffic (vehicles with trailers / caravans and the like)

The purpose of community facility signs (white on blue) is to advise road users of the direction to facilities, generally of a non-commercial nature, which are located on the side streets. Typical facilities that meet Main Roads requirements include:

Town halls, civic centres  
Municipal depots, offices, tips  
Sporting and recreational groups and facilities  
Hospitals  
Railway, coach stations  
Post offices  
Tertiary education institutions  
Churches  
Airports  
Major shopping centres (Rural Only)
