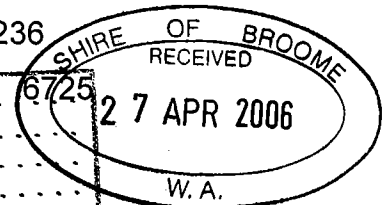

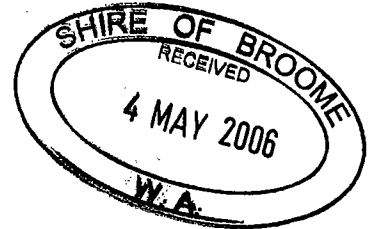
Prior to my relocation to Broome I was employed for over thirty-five years in Local Government in New South Wales. This has given me a strong understanding of policies and procedures of Local Government.

I wish to make application to the Shire of Broome to be a member of the Cable Beach Management Committee as a Community representative. To support my application I offer the following background information:

My first involvement with the Community of Broome was as a soil technician for the Main Roads Dept' during the process of construction and sealing of Chinatown streets in 1977. Since my initial 5-year Kimberley "stint" based in Derby, I have maintained an interest in Broome as a regular visitor and witnessed the development and growth of the town over a period of 28 years. I have been a permanent resident of Broome since 1998 and have owned property in Broome since mid 1999.

I have managed and owned retail businesses in Broome. I am currently employed full time as an Educational Business Manager by the Dept of Education & Training.

I have represented Community interests and views at a variety of levels in the past. Issues dealt with included recreational diving, fishing, general coastal access and Marine Park policy development.

I have been a member of the following WA State Government statutory bodies as a merit selected Community representative:

WA Marron Committee. (Development of recreational fishery strategies and policy)
State Recreational Fishing Advisory Committee. (Development of recreational fishery strategies and policy)
Geographe Bay Fishing Industry Liaison Committee (Development of commercial recreational fishery strategies and policy)

I have been a Committee Member of the following groups:

SW Recreational Fishing & Diving Association (Lobby group)
Ocean Resources Committee of Christmas Island (Shire backed advisory group developing recreational and commercial management policies)

Whilst on Christmas Island and prior to moving to Broome, I consulted to Parks Australia North to review and finalise their Christmas Island Marine Park Management Plan.


As a fishing and boating freelance correspondent for a 10 year period in the 80's & 90's, I was closely involved with many coastal Community and Industry issues, presenting these to the general public in both print and radio format. Relevant issues included vehicular beach access in the Bunbury area and the Keep Our Coast Open campaign developed by the Pemberton Apex Club.

As detailed, I have extensive experience as a Community representative and correspondent dealing with matters of coastal access, resources management and resource sharing. This equips me with a sound background knowledge of the processes involved in the development of a Management Plan and it's associated complexities.

My wife and myself regularly access Cable Beach (min' 3 x per week all year round) to partake in exercise, boating and social activities. My personal views are therefore based on a long term, regular association with the Cable Beach area and as a member of the Community with a wide range of friends and associates I believe I would an effective and valuable member of the proposed Management Committee.

Having spent 6 months travelling around Australia last year I have recent knowledge of policies and practices from a variety of locations with similar coastal management issues to that of Broome. I believe these observations may be of some interest to the Committee and will serve to widen the range of knowledge gathered during its considerations.

I have enjoyed previous challenges and tasks associated with Community consultative processes and would take great pleasure in having an input to a Committee that will make recommendations on one of Broome's and for that matter Australia's greatest natural assets.
