Have your say on skate parks in Broome



The Shire wants to know what the community wants from a skate park.

Are you a skateboarder, BMXer or scooter rider? Get along to the BRAC skate park at 3.30pm on Monday 29 June and let the Shire know what you want from Broome's skate park.

The Shire is conducting an assessment of the BRAC skate park with Australia's leading skate park designer and builder, Convic, and wants users' views on what works and what could be improved.

The assessment will result in a plan for the ongoing repair and maintenance of the existing facility, and a concept plan for minor upgrades and potential expansion of the existing park.

The community has expressed a desire for a new and improved skate park through several consultations including the Broome2040 visioning process, but due to budget constraints this is not something Council is planning in the short term.

The concept plan will be used to seek additional funding in coming years to carry out minor upgrades and potentially expand the existing park to maximise its use until Council is in a position to consider building a new skate park.
