Planning is already well underway for an exciting Australia Day 2016 in Broome.

The Australia Day Breakfast at Town Beach hosted by Broome Lions, Lionesses, Rotary and Roebuck Lodge is happening again on Tuesday 26 January, with the Shire presenting the Australia Day Active Citizenship Awards and Australian Citizenship Ceremony.

The Shire of Broome Australia Day Fireworks and Family Fun Day kicks off at Town Beach from 3pm.

The theme for the day/night event is Summer Water Fun, with three big water super slides direct from Perth, an all-ages foam party, obstacle challenge, late-night water park opening and more than 400 water pistols, along with food vans and market stalls.

At 8pm the sky will explode over Roebuck Bay with a fireworks display simulcast with Spirit 102.9

The soundtrack for this year's fireworks will be chosen by the community with a competition hosted by Spirit early in the new year.
