New YAC a voice for young people

Young people are being asked to put their names forward to join the new Broome Youth Advisory Council, as the Shire seeks to get them more involved in the future of the town.

The Youth Advisory Council, or YAC, is an important part of a new Broome Youth Engagement Framework that will guide the Shire's involvement in youth services.

A draft of the Framework is now available for public comment until 9 March 2016.

Broome Shire Councillor and YAC Chairperson, Mala Croft, says the YAC will provide support and enable young people

to have direct input into developing a Youth Action Plan.

"The plan will identify what the priorities are for young people in Broome, and provide a clear strategic direction to make sure Shire resources are used effectively," Cr Croft says.

"Importantly, we want young people to have input and to be actively involved, and forming a Youth Advisory Council is a key part of this."

Planning, building changes to improve bushfire safety

An information session will be held Wednesday 24 February to explain State Government changes to planning and building rules aimed at improving bushfire safety.

The new State Map of Bushfire Prone Areas includes parts of the Broome Shire and brings changes to requirements for planning and building approvals.

These new requirements come into effect on 8 April 2016 and may require new developments to undertake Bushfire Attack Level assessments and comply with the bushfire construction requirements of the Building Code of Australia.

The Shire of Broome will host an information session for businesses and interested community members on Wednesday 24 February from 3-4pm at the Shire Administration.

Remembering anniversary of air raid on Broome

Thursday 3 March will mark the 74th anniversary of the World War II air raid on Broome that killed 88 people and destroyed 22 Australian, Dutch and US aircraft.

On the morning of 3 March 1942, nine Japanese Zero fighters and a reconnaissance plane swooped down over Broome, leading to the second-greatest wartime loss of life on Australian soil.

Broome Shire President, Ron Johnston, says that while there is no official ceremony taking place this year, the Shire and the Broome RSL will lay wreaths at the war memorial in Bedford Park at 9am on Thursday 3 March.

"I would encourage others in the Broome community to join us at this time to commemorate this very significant occasion that played a big part in shaping our town as we know it today," Cr Johnston says.
