Exciting school holiday activities

The Broome Recreation and Aquatic Centre and Broome Public Library both have exciting school holiday programs coming up.

Both programs will run weekdays from Monday 3 July to Friday 14 July.

The Library's free 'Dinosaurs' themed program starts at 10.30am each day and runs for about an hour for children aged between 6 and 12 who must be accompanied by an adult.

The BRAC program runs for either a half day from 8am to

2.30pm, or a full day from 8am to 4.30pm, again for children 6 to 12, and there is a fee for attendance.

Are you a Shire of Broome ratepayer?

Are you a Shire of Broome ratepayer? We're currently finalising our 2017/18 budget and expect to issue rates notices on 19 July, with a due date for payment of 23 August 2017.

Broome Shire President, Ron Johnston, says Council has been able to keep rates rises to 1.75 per cent by minimising expenses while still delivering key projects including the Chinatown Revitalisation, Town Beach masterplan, BRAC Youth Precinct and more.

Ratepayers have the option of paying in full or paying in two or four instalments. Tentative instalment dates are as follows:

Single Instalment:

- Full payment due date – 23/8/2017

Two Instalments option:

- 1st instalment due date – 23/8/2017
- 2nd instalment due date – 25/10/2017

Four Instalments option:

- 1st instalment due date – 23/8/2017
- 2nd instalment due date – 25/10/2017
- 3rd instalment due date – 10/01/2018
- 4th instalment due date – 14/3/2018

If the instalment options shown above aren't suitable, you can request a weekly, fortnightly or monthly payment arrangement by emailing rates@broome.wa.gov.au.

A payment arrangement fee of \$45 is applicable and interest charges will continue to accrue until outstanding rates are paid. If you've changed your residential address and/or postal address or other contact details such as mobile number or email log on to www.broome.wa.gov.au/About-Council/Rates-Fees-Charges/Change-My-Address to update your contact details.

Ratepayers also have the option of receiving rates correspondence via email. To take up this option simply send a request to shire@broome.wa.gov.au before 7 July.

Popular new facility for caravans

An unsung new facility is helping make Broome a more attractive destination for tourists with caravans and motorhomes.

A new public dump point has been installed behind the Broome Visitor Centre so that caravanners, motorhome and RV drivers can deposit their waste hygienically.

The new facility was funded by Tourism WA and installed by the Shire of Broome with support from the Campervan and Motorhome Club of Australia, and has been well used since its installation last month.
