#### Protecting Broome against bushfire

Preventing bushfires is the responsibility of the whole Broome community, and property owners and occupiers have until 15 May to take action.

The Broome Fire Hazard Reduction Notice has now been advertised, and letters and brochures posted to affected residents outlining their responsibilities including installing firebreaks and other fire mitigation measures.

In 2017 more than 75 per cent of properties did not comply with the requirements by the deadline, which necessitated a strict enforcement program to ensure the community's safety.

For those wanting more information a community information session will be held this Saturday, 21 April, from 8-11am at the fire station on Frederick St,

with Shire Rangers, Department of Fire and Emergency Services and others available to answer questions and provide advice.

Shire of Broome Director Development and Community, Aletta Nugent, says landowners who fail to put in the required firebreaks and other measures are putting themselves, the community and firefighters at risk.

"Bushfires are a serious threat in Broome, especially following the record wet season we experienced this year," Ms Nugent says.

"Firebreaks and other measures are vital to decrease the risk of bushfires by halting their spread, and also in helping fight bushfires by allowing safe access for firefighters and their vehicles."

## Improving access and inclusion in Broome

The Shire of Broome has undertaken a review of its Disability Access and Inclusion Plan (DAIP) and is seeking any input from the wider community.

The WA Disability Services Act 1993 requires that local governments have a DAIP in place and that it must be updated every five years.

The purpose of the DAIP is to set out strategies to ensure that people with a disability can access local government

services, and that these services facilitate increased independence, opportunities and inclusion for people with a disability.

A draft DAIP has been developed following recent consultation including meeting with key stakeholders and organisations, and an online community survey.

The plan can be viewed at the Shire Administration Office or on the Shire website, and submissions can be made on or before 4pm on Monday, 23 April 2018.

## **Preparations underway for Anzac Day**

Broome's Anzac Day Dawn Service will be held at the Broome War Memorial in Bedford Park on Wednesday 25 April at 5.15am.

Parade participants are asked to form up in Weld St at the front of Broome Primary School at 5am.

Hosted by the Broome RSL Sub Branch, the Dawn Service will be followed by a traditional Gunfire Breakfast at the Broome RSL on the corner of Robinson and Barker St, with all welcome.

Please note that road closures will be in place around Bedford Memorial Park during the event, with disability parking available at the eastern end of Anne St.
