## Keep the speed down on Cable Beach

Broome's beaches are filling up fast with people wanting to enjoy our beautiful coastline and sunsets, making safety paramount including observing the 15kmh speed limit on Cable Beach.

Shire Rangers are now tackling the ongoing issue of vehicles exceeding the speed limit on Cable Beach both north of the rocks and at Gantheaume Point.

Rangers are armed with a new laser speed gun and have undergone training in monitoring and enforcing the laws relating to vehicle speeds on our beaches.

With this new tool at their disposal, Rangers will be on the beach regularly to collect data on vehicle speeds and enforce the speed limit with warnings and infringements where required.

## Free E-waste recycling coming to Broome

Did you know that 17 million televisions and 37 million computers have been sent to landfill since 2008 in Australia?

The Shire and TechCollect are working to put an end to this with free permanent e-waste recycling now at Broome's Waste Management Facility on Buckley's Rd.

Electronic waste is composed of many materials harmful to the environment and when not recycled can put human health and the environment at risk.

Warren Overton, CEO of ANZRP, which runs the TechCollect program, says the partnership is a great outcome for Broome and the community can now ensure their unwanted electronics will not end up in landfill, but be recovered and responsibly recycled.

Items accepted include personal and laptop computers and cables; tablets, notebooks and palmtops; computer monitors and parts; computer peripherals and accessories such as mice, keyboards, web cameras,

USBs and modems; printers, faxes, scanners and multi-functional devices; and TVs.

## Turning green waste into free garden mulch

With record amounts of green waste deposited at the Waste Management Facility this year, the community is being encouraged to make the most of free mulch.

Garden mulch is available free of charge from the facility on Buckley's Rd, and can be self-loaded at any time during opening hours or can be loaded by staff on Saturdays between 8am and 11am.

Residents can deposit uncontaminated green waste for free at the Waste Management Facility during opening hours.
