Free household drop-off at waste facility

The Shire is offering two weekends of free household waste drop off at the Waste Management Facility to help prepare for cyclone season.

This year, the annual pre-cyclone waste disposal weekends will be 27-28 October and 3-4 November and is available to residents, in addition to the six free waste passes supplied each year to ratepayers. There will be no kerbside collection.

Eligible items include white goods; scrap metal; furniture and mattresses; e-waste; batteries; green waste and timber; and oil.

Items NOT eligible include tyres and car parts, gas bottles, asbestos, paint, liquid waste, chemical or hazardous waste; commercial and demolition waste; flares; and fire extinguishers.

The Waste Management Facility is open 7.30am to 3.30pm Saturday and 8am to 2pm Sunday.

Seniors and residents with mobility limitations can request help to remove items from their property by contacting the Shire Office. Limits apply.

Beach closures helping protect turtles

The impact of vehicles on turtles nesting on Cable Beach will again be managed with night-time closures in place from next week.

The Cable Beach north access ramp will be closed to vehicles from 8pm to 6am each day between 9 October 2018 and 25 February 2019.

The beach will also be closed to vehicles two hours either side of high tides of 9m or more.

Broome Shire President, Harold Tracey, says the main species nesting on Cable Beach is the Flatback Turtle, which is threatened and is protected under WA legislation.

"They generally nest at the top of the beach above the high tide mark where their nests can be damaged by vehicles compacting sand and crushing nests," Cr Tracey says.

"Wheel ruts can also prevent hatchlings making their way to the water, and vehicle lights can disturb and confuse hatchlings."
