

## Town Beach Café redevelopment plans move a step forward



The Shire is going ahead with plans to replace the old Town Beach Café with a contemporary building that will be capable of delivering a year-round family-friendly dining and café experience for locals and tourists

In May, the Shire intends to advertise for Expressions of Interest nationally, for a suitable business to build and operate a new café at Guwarri Town Beach.

Respondents will be asked to design, build and operate a facility that will capitalise on Broome's alfresco dry-season climate from May to October, and offer an enclosed, air-conditioned venue throughout the shoulder season and into the wet season.

A lease of 21 years and a renewal option for a further 21 years is being offered.

The existing café has been closed since the previous lease expired in October last year. The Shire advertised a short-term lease opportunity while the process of finding a business to redevelop the café was undertaken.

Unfortunately, a temporary operator was unable to be secured.

To fill the void, local food vans will come to the rescue and will commence trading at the Town Beach Café site next month.

Broome Shire President Desiree Male said the Town Beach Café was a long-time favourite, but the building is no longer fit for purpose for traders who want to operate all year round.

"The glorious Guwarri Town Beach Foreshore Redevelopment has seen the precinct become activated throughout the year and well into the evenings.

"The area is now screaming out for a facility that can accommodate more people in comfort through the year.

"Until then, it will be great to have some of our wonderful food vans operating in the precinct at regular times so people can make plans to catch up at Town Beach around them."

## Shire offers compost and recycle bin rebates to encourage sustainability

The Shire of Broome is introducing a rebate scheme to encourage residents to compost or recycle household waste to reduce the amount of refuse going to landfill.

The Home Composting & Dual Bin Rebate will see the Shire reimburse eligible residents who purchase selected compost bins or dual rubbish bins with a recycling tub.

Instead of choosing a specific product purchased directly from the Shire, several options will be available to suit different households.

The rebate will apply to the following products:

- Subpod Classic Worm Farm In-Ground Home Composting Bin, from [Subpod.com.au](http://Subpod.com.au) or suppliers.
- The Subpod Mini Worm Farm for Small Spaces Compost Bin, from [Subpod.com.au](http://Subpod.com.au) or suppliers
- Bokashi Indoor compost bin (or equivalent),
- Dural Eko 24-litre + 12-litre Stainless Steel Twin Pedal Bin (or equivalent).

Successful applicants will receive a rebate of 50 per cent of the purchase price capped to a maximum of \$160 for the Subpod products, and \$50 for an indoor compost bin and dual pedal bin.

To be eligible for the rebate:

- You must be a Shire of Broome resident.
- The item must have been purchased from January 2023 onwards.
- You need to provide a receipt or screen capture of the purchase that show the date of purchase, the details and cost of the items purchased and your full name.
- You can't have previously successfully applied for the home composting and dual-bin rebate.

Only one rebate per household is permitted, with the scheme to run until the allocated budget has been reached.
