## Have your say in Local Government Election

Local Government elections will be held Saturday 19 October, with early voting available until 4pm Friday 18 October at the Shire Administration. Fifteen candidates have nominated for the vacancies in the Broome Ward, with one nomination received for one vacancy in the Dampier Ward and Cr Eliza Foy re-elected unopposed.

The Shire of Broome has nine elected members representing two wards, and Councillors hold office for a four-year term with odd year elections every two years and about half the Councillors' terms finishing at each election.

Shire of Broome CEO, Sam Mastrolambro, says Local Government elections play an important role in our democracy and are an important opportunity for people to be involved in their community.

## Temporary closures to protect turtles

The impact of vehicles on turtles nesting at Cable Beach is again being managed with night-time closures now in place.

The Cable Beach north access ramp is closed to vehicles between 8pm and 6am each day during turtle nesting season from 1 Oct to 29 Feb 2020, and for two hours either side of high tides 0.9m or more.

Penalties of up to \$200 apply for anyone disregarding the beach closures under Shire of Broome Local Laws.

Broome Shire President, Harold Tracey, says the main species nesting on Cable Beach is the Hawksbill Turtle, which is threatened and is protected under WA legislation.

## Award win for Chinatown Revitalisation

The Chinatown Revitalisation Project has won the award for Excellence in Urban Renewal from the Urban Development Institute of Australia WA.

Broome Shire President, Harold Tracey, says the award is due recognition for the whole Broome community that collaborated on the exciting project.

"This accolade shows that what we achieved for Broome through the Chinatown Revitalisation Project really is first class," Cr Tracey says.

"We thank all of those involved including our project partners, contractors, Community and Stakeholder Reference Group, and particularly the traders and property owners of Chinatown."

The Chinatown Revitalisation Project injected \$14 million into Broome's town centre to create a more inviting and pedestrian-friendly streetscape that will attract more visitors and enhance their experience and benefit the local economy.

## Operating short-stay accommodation at home

Broome's an extraordinary holiday destination and attracts major sporting, cultural and business events.

However, concerns have been raised about the number of residential homes being made available for short-stay accommodation.

Local Planning Scheme No. 6 controls land use and development in the Shire and defines different short-stay accommodation land uses and nominates zones where this can be done.

Landowners making rooms available for short-stay use while living in the house is defined as a "bed and breakfast" which can be undertaken from Residential-zoned properties if development approval has been obtained from the Shire.

Landowners making their house available for short-stay accommodation (less than three months in any 12-month period) is defined as a "holiday home" which is not permitted from a Residential-zoned property.

Therefore, any landowner with their whole house available for short-stay accommodation in a Residential zone is in breach of Local Planning Scheme No. 6 and incurs substantial financial penalties.
