Exciting Town Beach Project progressing

Work on the \$11.3M Stage One of the Town Beach Project is on schedule for completion by the end of the year.

New playgrounds, youth space, markets area, community art and historical information is under construction with local firm Roadline Civil Contractors carrying out work with funding from the Shire of Broome and Lotterywest.

Completed work includes the rock seawall and grassed terraces, the extension of Hamersley St, and car and boat trailer parking for Catalinas boat ramp.

The final sub-project in Stage One will be to expand the popular water park.

Broome Shire President, Harold Tracey, says the Town Beach Project is creating a vibrant and inclusive community space.

"It's really exciting to see the Town Beach Project taking shape as a space that will bring together people of all ages, cultures and abilities, preserve Broome's history, Indigenous culture and unique environment, all while boosting tourism and the local economy," Cr Tracey says.

Stage Two of the Town Beach Project includes upgrading the existing rock groyne and constructing a 120m-long all-access jetty from the end of the groyne, restoring the Pioneer Cemetery, Lions Pioneer Park and the foreshore park including lighting, youth art and exercise equipment, with the Shire of Broome still seeking the balance of funding.
