Broome Cemetery works underway

The Shire of Broome is currently undertaking work at the Broome Cemetery, with the upgrades aimed at improving the facility for members of the public.

The project will be split into two stages, with a concept design portrayed in the image above.

Shire works crew have been busy upgrading the cemetery's internal gravel roads in recent weeks to make the facility more accessible and improve the amenity of the area.

The new roads will be sealed to make vehicle access smoother and ensure follow-up maintenance work needs to occur on a less-frequent basis.

Survey works are also set to take place, with trees to be trimmed and the grounds improved.

There will also be a kerbing project undertaken.

Shire of Broome president Harold Tracey said the community could expect an improved and more modern cemetery once the project was completed.

"The Shire has listened to the community and commenced work to ensure the Broome Cemetery meets expectations and is more user-friendly," he said.

"I am aware that many members of the community visit the cemetery on a frequent basis and Council is keen to continue upgrades in accordance with our Cemetery Master Plan."

The initial work is set to be concluded by the end of March.

The Shire of Broome thanks the community for its patience whilst this work is undertaken.

The Shire of Broome is proposing to commence a Major Land Transaction at Lot 555, on Deposited Land 77711, in relation to Roebuck Bay Caravan Park and Town Beach Cafe.

Business Plans proposing the lease and redevelopment of these sites have been prepared as required under the Local Government Act (1995). The Shire hopes to attract a proponent to agree to a long-term lease at these sites, with the goal of maximising activation at Town Beach. Council will now be seeking comments on these redevelopment opportunities through a six-week public consultation window.
