Dash and Splash back for 2020



With local sport back close to full flight and BRAC busy as ever, the popular Dash and Splash events are back for 2020.

There will be three events in the series, to be held at 5pm on Friday 18 September, Friday 30 October and Friday 27 November.

The short course is a 2km run with a 200m swim, while the long course is a 4km run with a 400m swim.

Both events can be completed as an individual, or adult competitors can tackle the long course as a duo.

Juniors have the option to tackle the short course as a duo or compete against the adults in the long course as a duo. This season will also see the return of the popular parent-child short course teams.

Shire lands award for Town Beach project



The Shire of Broome has won a state award for its work on the Town Beach Foreshore Redevelopment project.

Representatives from the Shire travelled to Perth earlier this month for the Parks & Leisure WA 2020 Awards of Excellence, which recognises and celebrates the initiatives and efforts of 'the people behind the places'.

The Shire claimed victory in the Playspace Award (> \$0.5M) category, edging out competition from

Whiteman Park, Manjimup, Claremont, Amberton Beach, Port Hedland and Shorehaven.

The Town Beach Foreshore Redevelopment is a \$24 million project, jointly funded by the Shire and the WA State Government.

Shire of Broome president Harold Tracey said Town Beach had been transformed over the last 18 months and was a major asset for Broome

Shire of Broome chief executive officer Sam Mastrolembo said the strong relationship between the local government and Nyamba Buru Yawuru was made stronger through the training day and there was clear ongoing commitment to meaningfully engage, communicate and collaborate from both parties.
