"The Town Beach foreshore has been rejuvenated in recent years in a \$24 million project and it's always great to see our community making the most of the fantastic new amenities.

"Events like the fishing day are a great example of the Shire working with service organisations to provide engaging youth services, while our school holiday program at BRAC, the library and Civic Centre was again massively popular.

The team have also been busy completing the final sections of footpaths and rock walls on **Carnarvon Street, with the remaining areas of** kerbing also being focused on.

New light poles will be installed on Short Street East in the near future, while line-marking has een taking place across the precinct.

Shire of Broome president Harold Tracey said the final touches were been applied.

"Another big thank you to the community for your patience during this project and for supporting our impacted Chinatown retailers over the last six months," he said.
