BRAC Car Park Reconstruction Project Underway



Works have commenced on the construction of a new carpark at Broome Recreation and Aquatic Centre, next to Father McMahon Oval.

The project will see the upgrade of the existing carpark, with the works involving the sealing of the carpark, and construction of new footpaths and kerbs. We will also be putting in new trees to provide some much-needed shade in the area.

The project is funded by the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure grant, and we are timing construction to take advantage of the relatively quiet period for Broome sport.

We are hoping the work will be completed by February. Plenty of parking is still available next to Nipper Roe oval, and adjacent to the multi-use courts.
