Beach Books and Storytime to celebrate Library Week

Library and Information Week gets underway on Monday, and Broome Public Library is celebrating with several fun events.

Library and Information Week runs from May 22 to 26, and will include National Simultaneous Storytime and the launch of Broome Beach Books for 2017.

Shire of Broome Library Coordinator, Sally Eaton, said Broome Beach Books would kick off on Wednesday 24 May at 11am at Cable Beach, and run each Wednesday from 11am to 11.45am until 4 October.

"A Library staff member will be at the top of the stairs at Cable Beach each week with a selection of books just perfect for reading by the ocean," Ms Eaton said.
