Cr Harold Tracey steps down from Shire Presidency with an incredible legacy



In 2013, local businessman Harold Tracey declared his interest in running for Broome Shire Council, having already made a valuable contribution to the area through his business, and involvement with a number of community and sporting organisations.

In his pitch for election, he wrote: "We face many challenges in the coming years, both economically and socially in the town.

"I believe my experience in dealing with local issues and local people, and my background with youth development and mentorship, along with my experience in running a successful local business will be an advantage in ensuring a positive future for our Shire, while still maintaining the balance, history, and culture."

Cr Harold Tracey didn't imagine that 10 years later he would still be on Council having spent six of them as Shire President, during which time he has presided over and personally supported significant improvements to Shire infrastructure, community development, and economic growth.

His decision to step down from the shire presidency is cause to reflect on his many achievements, said Shire of Broome CEO Sam Mastrolembo.

"Harold became the face and voice for the Shire, he has worked incredibly hard behind the scenes to lobby other tiers of Government for the benefit our community, Mr Mastrolembo said. "But there have been many successes achieved behind the scenes, including his advocacy for funding for major projects and a shake up of resources and policies to address youth crime, alcohol-related harm, housing and many other community priorities.

"I'm very pleased that he will be staying on a councillor."

Cr Desiree Male, who has been Deputy Shire President throughout Cr Tracey's six-year presidency, described him as a true leader with incredible patience.

"Harold has always been inclusive of everyone in the community, and always considered both sides of any issue or debate," she said.

"When you look at what has been accomplished around the place during the past six years, it's easy to conclude that he has achieved more than any other Shire President in Broome's entire history."
