## Help shape McMahon Estate's future



Members of the McMahon Estate Local Structure Plan Community and Stakeholder Reference Group recently joined the group's chairperson, Councillor Jan Lewis, Shire CEO Sam Mastrolembro and staff on a site walk in the area. The tour provided a chance for members of the group who live in the area to express their views on what changes they would like to see and what they feel should be preserved. While the group will provide valuable input into the project, the Shire is still seeking general public input to guide the development of the McMahon Estate, Cable Beach. The primary focus of the project will be to deliver housing for Broome in line with a Local Structure Plan.

It will consider:

- Affordable housing and open space
- Improved connectivity with a focus on safety and legibility
- Integration of drainage using water-sensitive urban design principles.

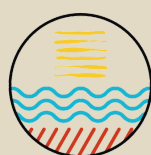

- Broome Surf Life Saving Club remains open but there is no beach access from there.
- Primary beach access to Cable Beach is the stairs 90m to the north of Cable Beach House restaurant.
- Lighting has been installed along the temporary path leading to the Surf Club.
- A shade sail has been installed at the playground.
- Footpath works are continuing near the entrance of the Surf Club car park.
