\$6m Lotterywest grant for Cable Beach Foreshore project



The Cable Beach Foreshore Redevelopment project has received a significant boost, thanks to a \$6 million grant from Lotterywest.

The funding provides \$1 million for Stage 1 works and a further \$5 million for Stage 2 works.

The Stage 1 funding is assigned to the youth hub behind the Broome Surf Club, which will include a skate park and half-court basketball court, and cultural art and interpretation signage.

The \$12 million Stage 1 works, which are predominantly funded by \$10 million in Federal Government grants and the Lotterywest contribution, are out to tender and due to commence later this year.

The remaining \$5 million from the Lotterywest grant will contribute to a significant amount of the Stage 2 works at the northern end of the precinct, including the protection of the Monsoon Vine Thicket, interpretative signage and significantly the construction of a climbing wall and themed water playground.

Broome Shire President Desiree Male said the Lotterywest

funding is an amazing result for Broome and that she 'couldn't be happier'.
