### Upgrade projects continue around town

Work is continuing on a range of projects around Broome aimed at improving the amenity of the town.

The connection of Frederick St and Dampier Tce is progressing as part of the Chinatown Development Strategy.

The \$600,000 project is jointly funded by the Shire and Tourism WA and includes connecting the two roads with a raised brick-paved thoroughfare, improved drainage, and new footpaths, parking bays and 10 new street lights.

Work on relocating the taxi rank at Paspaley Plaza from the entrance on Carnarvon St to the Short St side of the complex is also continuing.

Moving the taxi rank was requested by Chinatown traders as a means of helping alleviate concerns around anti-social behaviour at the main entry to the shopping centre.

Work on the Cable Beach north access ramp will extend the overtaking bays and upgrade drainage and kerbs.

The access ramp will stay open while work is underway, but there will be traffic controls in place during working hours.

Work finished last week on widening the entry to Town Beach car park to provide safer and easier access at the popular location for bigger vehicles and those towing boats and trailers.

The Shire has trialled several techniques for identifying street numbers in recent years including painting, but the new reflective aluminium plates have proven the most effective.

The aluminium plate has a reflective number on a black background with a clear protective coating and is fixed to the kerb outside the property.

The numbering will be rolled out in stages, with the Shire initially targeting longer streets which can prove more difficult for emergency services and taxis to find house numbers compared to shorter streets.

So far this has included Reid Rd, Sanderling Dve, Herbert St and Anne St, with others to follow.

## Staircase Markets get underway for 2016

The popular Staircase to the Moon Night Markets kick off for 2016 on 23 and 24 April with the Shire of Broome again providing support.

The Shire has contributed just over \$34,000 in sponsorship to support the Staircase Markets in 2015/16 – more than double the previous year's contribution.

Broome Shire President, Ron Johnston, says the funding helps the Broome Community Stallholders Association to cover operational expenses including traffic control, lighting and waste management.

"The Staircase to the Moon Night Markets at Town Beach are hugely popular with locals and visitors, and the Shire is pleased to support the committee and the stallholders to grow these great events," Cr Johnston says.
