Interested in becoming a Shire Councillor?

The Shire of Broome will host an information session on Wednesday 6 September for anyone wanting to find out about becoming a Shire Councillor.

Local Government elections will be held on 21 October 2017, with four positions on the Broome Shire Council to be contested.

Nominations to run for Council are open from 7-14 September 2017.

Shire of Broome CEO, Sam Mastrolembo, says he will provide a presentation to the information session and answer any questions.

"This will be an informal occasion and a chance for anyone interested in representing their community as a Shire Councillor to have a chat, ask some questions and find out more about Local Government and the responsibilities of being a Councillor," Mr Mastrolembo says.

Local Government elections will be held on 21 October this year.

Residents and ratepayers are also encouraged to make sure they are enrolled to vote in Local Government elections, with rolls closing on 1 September 2017.

Sister City exchange marks anniversary

A group from Broome's Sister City of Taiji in Japan has visited the town to celebrate the 10th anniversary of the annual student exchange with St Mary's College.

The group of 23 included seven exchange students, former exchange students, families who have hosted Broome students, and representatives of the Taiji Town Office and Board of Education.

Acting Broome Shire President, Harold Tracey, says the exchange is an important way of keeping alive the

relationship between the two towns that goes back more than 100 years.

From the late 1800s, skilled pearl divers from Taiji and Japan came to Broome and were instrumental in the early days of the pearling industry, along with helping to found Broome's first school and hospital.

Broome's Japanese cemetery is believed to be the biggest outside of Japan, with more than 900 graves and 700 tombstones.

Broome's banner takes out the prize

For the second year running Broome's entry in the State-wide Banners in the Terrace competition has won the secondary school category.

The 3m-tall banner designed by St Mary's College Year 9 Joel Hill was displayed on St George's Tce in Perth as part of WA's biggest annual community art projects.

The Banners in the Terrace event is run by the WA Local Government Association as part of the WA Local Government Convention.

Representatives from shires, towns and cities around the State gathered in Perth where the banners were displayed from 23 July to 5 August.

Broome's 2016 entry was designed by St Mary's College student John Bill Quilisadio and also won the secondary school category.
