Broome sports season gets ready for kick off

Broome's 2018 sporting season will kick off on Monday 12 February with a Season Launch at the Mercure Hotel.

Broome is represented by more than 50 sporting clubs and the launch event is an opportunity for their members to come together with key sporting stakeholders to gain an understanding of the opportunities available in 2018.

Shire of Broome Club Development Officer, Mike Doyle, says the season launch also marks the beginning of the Club Development Workshop Series, and Shire staff will be on hand to provide information on plans for facility development, volunteer assistance and support for event management.

Special guest Tom Chapman from the Department of Mines, Regulation and Safety will provide an overview of what clubs should be doing to comply with the Incorporation Act legislation, including the process for updating a club constitution.

Broome Public Library has become WA's latest library service to achieve accreditation through the eSmart Libraries framework.

eSmart Libraries helps to incorporate digital literacy and improve cybersafety while offering patrons ways to deal with cyberbullying, and is delivered through the Alannah & Madeline Foundation and Telstra Foundation.

Alannah & Madeline Foundation CEO, Lesley Podesta, says being eSmart means having the knowledge to guard against security and privacy risks, to research and download content ethically and legally, and manage reputation and relationship-based issues online.

Shire of Broome Library Coordinator, Sally Eaton, says Broome Public Library is working with the community to provide safe access and education in using digital technology through initiatives such as offering free basic computing classes and free Wi-Fi.

"More and more services are going online, but a lot of people in our community don't have their own devices or access so they come to us for help, and this is our response to be able to provide that safely," Ms Eaton says.

Chinatown grant funding

The 2018 Chinatown Revitalisation grant round for Activation and Laneway enhancement projects is open until 16 February.

The funding round has been developed to stimulate and encourage activation and laneway enhancements in Chinatown by supporting and rewarding local businesses and interest groups.
