New faces sworn into Council

The new Shire of Broome Council was sworn in on October the swearing-in to elect a Deputy President, with 23, two days after the results of the 2023 Shire Election were formerly declared.

The Council includes four new faces; Jan Lewis, Johani Mamid, Ellen Smith and Melanie Virgo, who join Councillors Desiree Male, Phillip Matsumoto, Peter Taylor, and Chris Mitchell who won the popular vote to be Shire President at the weekend.

All were sworn in at a brief ceremony, where they read aloud and signed the Declaration required under the Local Government Act 1995, witnessed by Honorary Freeman, Kim Male JP. A Special Meeting of Council was held after

Cr Male again taking on the role she held for six years before serving as Shire President for six months from April 2023.

Cr Male secured six of the eight Councillor votes, with the remaining two going to Cr Smith, who was the only other nominee.

The new council is next scheduled to meet at the November Ordinary Meeting of Council on the 16th. The ninth Council seat formerly occupied by former Shire President Harold Tracey remains vacant and would need to be filled through a separate election.

Join the McMahon Estate stakeholder reference group

McMahon Estate, a 10ha parcel of land located centrally within the south Cable Beach locality, was recently rezoned as 'Urban Development' under the new Local Planning Scheme No.7. (LPS7).

Future development of the site requires an approved local structure plan prior to any future subdivision or development taking place.

Broome residents are invited to submit an expression of interest to join the McMahon Estate Local Structure Plan Community and Stakeholder Reference Group (MECSRG).

The purpose of the Group is to:

- Provide input to the Shire and Council for the preparation of McMahon Estate Local Structure Plan that will guide a residential development with appropriate public open space and drainage.
- Ensure the community and key stakeholders are appropriately engaged in the local structure plan preparation phase of the project.
- Act as a conduit between the Shire, Council and the community, businesses and residents. To submit an expression of interest to join the MECSRG,

Draft Town Beach Foreshore Management Plan consultation



The Shire of Broome has developed the Draft Town Beach Foreshore Management Plan to guide the use and development of the area between Town Beach Jetty and Demco Reserve. The Draft Plan follows community and stakeholder engagement on the use and aspirations for this highly valued public space. A key recommendation of the Shire's Coasta Hazard and Risk Management and Adaptation Plan, the Draft Plan addresses issues such as balancing community expectations with desired environmental, economic and recreational outcomes. It also provides a framework for the ongoing use, management and development of the area while considering coastal processes.
