Successful Tendering for Shire contracts workshops

The Shire has unveiled changes to its procurement process, with local businesses starting to buy in. VendorPanel Marketplace, which is free for suppliers to use, invites companies to submit quotes and tenders once work becomes available.

Once registered, they can receive invitations to quote on work across dozens of categories - from large building projects, to catering, to waste management.

Shire of Broome senior procurement and risk officer James Carpenter will discuss the new process in workshops on March 5 and 6.

Town Beach project moves to Stage two

The Shire of Broome is forging ahead with the Town Beach Precinct Upgrade, with Stage two of the exciting project underway.

While the new playground has been a big hit with local families, there is a lot more to be excited about at this much-loved location.

The Shire have installed a new public ablution block, boat trailer parking and a coastal footpath to make Town Beach more accessible and user-friendly.

Public artworks have been placed, while the turf and garden bed areas are starting to come to life.

To launch Stage two, work has started on the groyne area. The popular Town Beach water park is being revamped and extended, with work beginning earlier this month.

This means the water park is currently closed, but it

will be back bigger and better in the not-too-distant future. Thank you for your patience while this project is completed.

With design plans coming along for other areas of Town Beach, the precinct is set to be overhauled.

Shire of Broome president Harold Tracey said once completed, Town Beach would be a major attraction for residents and tourists alike.

"This substantial project has been planned meticulously and been in the works for quite a few years," he said.

"To see the precinct come to life is fantastic and the future upgrades will help make best use of one of Broome's most-scenic locations."

The Shire has worked in partnership with the state government, Lotterywest and Main Roads WA to fund the project.
