Chinatown recognised in awards

The winners of the 2020 Planning Institute National Awards for Planning Excellence were announced on September 24, with the revitalisation of Chinatown in Broome recognised.

The Chinatown Revitalisation Project is a \$29.3 million initiative being funded by the Shire of Broome and WA State Government, with Stage 1 completed last year.

A commendation award was granted to the Chinatown team at the PIA Awards in the 'From Plan to Place' category.

This follows on from the project taking out the same award at the WA planning awards last year.

Plenty on the agenda for Broome's youth



The Shire of Broome is committed to providing services and activities for our young people, with an action-packed couple of weeks recently for our next generation.

A Youth Activities Day was held at Town Beach on Wednesday, September 30, with around 150 young people descending on the area to enjoy the event.

Organised by the Shire of Broome's Youth Advisory Council in partnership with local stakeholders, the day was a major success.

With the October School Holidays upon us, there has been a busy schedule at the library and Broome Recreation and Aquatic Centre.

There has been daily fun for youngsters over the last two weeks at the library, while the Shire has been working with external partners to provide programming events.

The Telstra Foundation recently donated \$2500 worth of robotics to the library, with 17 young people attending the initial session.

Plans are also firmly in place to host a regular Coding Club at the library, which will help our kids to learn new



technical skills that could be a springboard for future employment opportunities.

Meanwhile, over at BRAC local youngsters have been having a blast by taking part in fun events such as LEGO Masters, water sports and a movie day.

Shire of Broome president Harold Tracey said providing infrastructure and programs for young people was a focus for the Council.

"In the Community Perceptions Survey the Shire rolled out earlier this year, the provision of youth services was one of the areas that residents stated they wanted improvement in," he said.

"The Shire has taken on board this important feedback and there is now a real effort to increase opportunities and events for our younger generation.

"It has been great to see local youngsters taking advantage of these services in recent weeks, with plenty more for us to do in this space."
